

- Favourite British sandwiches are bacon sandwiches (made with warm, fried bacon). A BLT is a bacon sandwich with lettuce and tomato. In some regions of England "sarnie" and "butty" are slang expressions for sandwich. Some people even eat potato chip butties! Very thin sandwiches filled with fine slices of cucumber are considered to be very upper class.
- The country where the sandwich was invented has a booming sandwich industry. Countless plastic-packed sandwiches are prepared for office workers at home and abroad. There are very successful UK sandwich chains like Pret-à-Manger. (Note the French name!)
- Today English sandwiches are exported all over the EU you can buy them in European cities from Paris to Oporto. They may not be crunchy like French baguettes, but no-one finds the soft bread and the simple, neutral-tasting fillings a complete turn-off. And the sandwiches stay fresh for a long time!
